## **REGISTRAR'S CIRCULAR NO. 6 OF 2001**

## ADMISSION OF ADVOCATES AND SOLICITORS – POSTING OF NOTICE ON THE SUPREME COURT WEBSITE

Under section 17(3) of the Legal Profession Act (Cap 161), a petitioner seeking to be admitted as an Advocate and Solicitor is required to file his petition at the Supreme Court Registry accompanied by a notice in Form D of the Legal Profession Rules, and the notice must be posted at the Supreme Court for 6 months before the petitioner is admitted as an Advocate and Solicitor.

2. With effect from 18 December 2001, the petitioner will be required to file the petition and all documents relating to the petition, including the abovementioned notice via the Electronic Filing Service. In order to promote the use of Information Technology as well as to capitalise on the widespread reach of the World Wide Web, such notices will no longer be posted by the Supreme Court Registry on the physical notice board of the Supreme Court but will instead be posted at the electronic notice board of the Supreme Court found at the Supreme Court website (www.supcourt.gov.sg). Anyone may then conveniently view the notices on the Supreme Court website from any computer with internet access. Further, the presence of info-kiosks at the Supreme Court itself will allow users to easily access the Supreme Court website to view the notices.
